I, Mrs. Eliza O. Moore, do hereby make application to the Commissioner of Pensions for a pension, to be granted me under the Act passed by the Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Texas, and approved April 7, A. D. 1913, on the following grounds:

I am the widow of L. M. Moore deceased, who departed this life on the 16 day of August, A. D. 1916, in the county of Waller in the State of Texas

I have not remarried since the death of my said husband, and I do solemnly swear that I was never divorced, from my said husband, and that I never voluntarily abandoned him during his life, but remained his true, faithful and lawful wife up to the date of his death. I was married to him on the 1st day of December, A. D. 1878, in the county of Waller, in the State of Texas

My husband, the said L. M. Moore, enlisted and served in the military service of the Confederate States during the war between the States of the United States, and that he did not desert the Confederate Service. I have been a resident of the State of Texas since prior to January 1, A. D. 1900, and have been continuously since a citizen of the State of Texas. I do further state that I do not receive from any source whatever money or other means of support amounting in value to the sum of \$300.00 per annum, nor do I own in my own right, nor does anyone hold in trust for my benefit or use, estate or property, either real, personal or mixed, either in fee or for life, of the value of one thousand dollars, exclusive of the home of the value of not over \$1000.00; nor do I receive any aid or pension from any other State, or from the United States, or from any other source, and I do further state that the answers given to the following questions are true:

1. What is your age? 55 years (Born 9-30-1860.)
2. Where were you born? Grimes County, Texas
3. How long have you resided in the State of Texas? All my life
4. How long have you resided in the county of your present residence? And what is your postoffice address? Every since County was organized, R. I. Hempstead, Texas.
5. Did your husband draw a pension? If so, give his file number. Yes - File No. 25556.
6. What was your husband's full name? Lewis Melvin Moore
7. What was the date of his death? August 16th, 1916.
8. In what State was your husband's command originally organized? Arkansas
9. How long did your husband serve? If known to you give date of enlistment and discharge. About two years.
10. What was the name or letter of the company, or number of the battalion, regiment or battery of artillery in which your husband served? If he was transferred from one branch of service to another, give time of transfer, description of command and time of service. Cont. Know. See file number 25556.

11. Name branch of service in which your husband served, whether infantry, cavalry, artillery, or the navy, or if commissioned as an officer by the President, his rank and line of duty, or if detailed for special service, under the law of conscription, the nature of such service, and time of service. 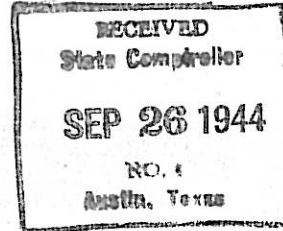

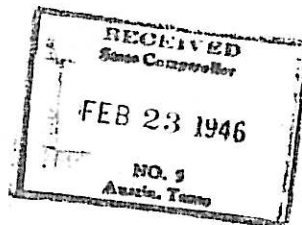

Dear Mr. Sheppard:

My mother, Mrs. Eliza O. Moore, of 6939 Sherman Street, Houston, Texas, and who draws a Texas Confederate Widows Pension is now confined to her bed from a light stroke of paralysis which she suffered about three months ago. She is practically helpless and we have to employ a practical nurse to help attend to her all the time. We have to pay for nurse hire, along, \$49.00 per week. This with other expenses such as doctors bill, medicine, etc. runs the total expense to something like \$300.00 per month. I wonder if there is any provision in the Texas pension law whereby she might be allowed any additional funds to help tide her through the helpless condition she is now in.

My mother had about \$500.00 in the bank when she was stricken but this along with the \$50.00 per month pension has been exhausted and I am having to meet the bills as they are presented.

I am not a wealthy man and my mother has no property whatever and if she lingers in her present condition for years or months it is going to be hard on me to have to meet monthly expenses amounting to around \$250.00. My mother is now in her 86 th. year.

I will appreciate you advising me by letter concerning this matter.

Dear Sir:

I acknowledge receipt of your letter of February 22 in which you state that your Mother, Mrs. Elisa O. Moore who is a Confederate Pensioner is confined to her bed from a light stroke and you ask if the Confederate Pension law allows any additional funds to help tide her through the helpless condition.

I am very sorry to advise the law makes no provision whatever for additional funds for Confederate Pensioners who are helpless. Under the present law \$50.00 per month is the maximum amount which can be paid a Confederate widow as a pension.

It might be possible that you could get additional assistance from the Department of Public Welfare by filing an application for Old Age Assistance for Mrs. Moore. This is merely a suggestion on my part.

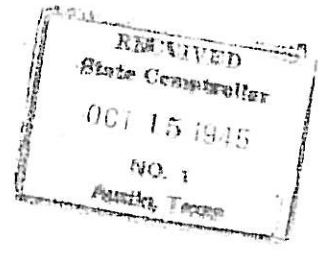




