cousin got from the library
"Life in Cornwall in the
mid 19th century" by R
W Barton.

¶ 834 One extract reads thus -
"Entered his own child"
A child of dissenting parents
having died in Newlyn
the Clergyman of the Parish was
applied to, to bury it, but 2 hrs
before the time appointed
for the funeral he refused
to read a burial service,
assigning as a reason that
the child had not been
baptized. The corpse was
however, taken to the grave
and having been deposited
in the house, appointed for
the living, the afflicted
father went outside and

interested his own child
after the manner generally
adopted by the Dissenters
while tears fell copiously
from a large concourse of
spectators. (23rd Feb 1838)

My cousin is going to call on
the Vicar of Newlyn & find
out the name, but she's
sure it is Prouse.)

She says there are Prouses at
Penzance, near Newlyn. KS

Also at Bideford,
in Devon.

William Giffard, Bishop of Winchester
Founded Waverley Abbey.

Sir Walter Giffard (1100 to 1270 AD) ^{manor} of Awton

Richard Giffard, Bishop of Winchester
and Chancellor to Henry III

Sir Walter, Archbishop of York &
Chancellor to Henry III

Hugh Giffard constable of the Tower
of London in 1235.

Alexander Giffard distinguished in
Crusade of 1240. Settled in Awton

Giffard, had the manors of Awton
& Weare, settled on them by Wm
the Conqueror, added Giffard to
the name. Also held Whitechurch &
Lamerton.

Sir Walter (Giffard) an ancestor
may be buried at Awton Giffard
